## Japan Trip Report - 2008

On the 12th of November last year 24 Year 10 and 11 students were accompanied by Mrs Steele and Mr Richardson on the annual sister school exchange program to Komae High School in Japan. The group arrived at Sydney airport ready to go, awake and alert for our overnight flight. 8 hours later we arrived at Narita airport, Tokyo. After buying everything from the Japanese vending machines, we hit the subway to our first destination.

We spent the day walking, sightseeing and shopping around the popular tourist locations of Harajuku and Asakusa. Feeling exhausted we trekked on to Izumi Tamagawa station to meet our hosts for the next two weeks. We heard the roar of welcome before we saw it. We were excited and a bit nervous to go home with our host students and meet our new families, but we were even more excited to see everyone next morning at school to compare experiences. Most of us caught 20 minute train trips to school and amused ourselves by trying to pronounce the names of the stations on the way. We were lucky if we ever got a seat. School was one of the greatest times for the group as we experienced real Japanese culture and school life. Also as we were able to get together we were relieved to finally speak English again! The language barrier was a lot of fun but we made many new friends that we would never forget.



Disneyland was definitely one of the highlights of our trip. Mrs Steele and Mr Richardson accompanied us on the train but as soon as we walked through the gates we were allowed to roam as we pleased in the park. It was very tiring but everyone had a lot of fun and left with a lot of memories.

On our last day at Komae High we had a farewell assembly during the day and a party at night. At the assembly, we gave speeches in Japanese expressing our gratitude to Komae for having us for the past two weeks. At the party we all said individual speeches in Japanese thanking our host families for their hospitality. The next morning, to our disappointment we all had to say goodbye to our host families. After an emotional departure from Izumi Tamagawa station we headed out to Kyoto on the classy bullet train for our 3 day excursion. We spent these last days sightseeing in Kyoto and Nara enjoying many beautiful Japanese temples and shrines which were surrounded with stunning garden scenery. We gained background knowledge about these places from our quirky tour guide.

The 3 day excursion to Kyoto marked the end of our stay in Japan and so on the 27th of November we sadly said goodbye to Japan as we left to head back to Australia.

On behalf of the students representing Kirrawee High on the Japan Trip we would like to say a big thank you to Mrs Steele and Mr Richardson for all the effort they put in to organising the trip and for making it such a rich experience. We all had a great time.

Each place was full of history. Vendors sold mini Eiffel Towers at a price of bartered value which was incredibly cheap yet still overcharged. On the 2<sup>nd</sup> last day of our trip we all went to Disneyland, festively decorated for Halloween. It offered us a mixture of bright colours, catchy music and rides such as Space Mountain 2. The day was full of blissful childhood memories, and ridiculously expensive souvenirs.

The last day was spent with our host families saying our goodbyes, and last minute shopping. With a tearful "*au revoir*" we were whisked off to the airport and boarded another 26 hour flight back to Sydney where we were to be greeted with open arms by our families and the School Certificate. ## School Uniform

Just a note about the importance of students wearing correct school uniform. Kirrawee High has a very good reputation in the community which stems from how our students conduct themselves and also how they present themselves. From our reputation, all Kirrawee students gain.

Thank you to the majority of students who are immaculately presented.

Parents are asked to adhere to the items described as our uniform. Students at times will try to convince their parents that other items are acceptable but it is only the prescribed ones that should be worn.

Under OH&S guidelines, leather shoes that cover the instep must be worn in practical classes – technics subjects, art and science. Girls should not wear the ballet style shoe that leaves their foot exposed as well as not supporting the foot.

Earrings other than studs and items of body piercing are considered a safety issue and must not be worn.

It is requested that students have enough items of plain white turn-down socks, plain white T-shirts for cool weather and shirts to last a number of days so that students are always dressed correctly.

If any parent has financial difficulties in purchasing the uniform, then please contact me and assistance can be given.

## School Excursions

A note about excursions at Kirrawee High. All excursions must be approved by the Principal and must be in accordance with DET guidelines in terms of safety and curriculum.

At times there may appear to be many excursions organized and this may cause some parents to have financial concerns depending on the years their children are in. The school is constantly monitoring the situation and adjusting as necessary.

A couple of points need to be reinforced:

- Excursions have a cut-off date when the permission note must be returned and money paid to school. If circumstances mean that this cannot be adhered to, then a phone call to the relevant faculty Head Teacher *before the cut-off date* will allow the student to be included on the excursion.
- Often, a number of excursions are organized and money collected at the one time. The school can only accept money up till 11.30 am (DET rules). If students are still in line when the bell rings for the start of school or to end recess, the money is collected from students in line and is then receipted.
- Deposits are often required to be paid and exact numbers attending excursions have to be known. Late inclusions are usually not possible.
- Buses are booked based on numbers attending as at the cut-off date. For safety reasons buses on excursions cannot be overloaded.
- Students who misbehave in class or in school generally, may not be allowed to attend excursions or outside activities.

## Early Leave Passes – New Procedures 2009

Due to the large number of students seeking early leave passes and due to notes that are incomplete (without specific reasons), procedures for seeking early leave passes have now changed after the trial held in Term 4 2008. The school is concerned that many students seeking passes are leaving the school grounds unsupervised and possibly without parental permission which affects their safety and well being.

Early leave passes are granted when students must leave school for appointments that cannot be made outside of school hours. This should occur only under exceptional circumstances. Notes requesting an early leave pass must include the following information:

- Student's name and roll class
- Specific Reason
- Whether the student will be collected from school or has permission to make their own arrangements

According to the Department of Education and Training, a ***justified*** reason as stated in the ***Regular School Attendance Information for Parents Brochure*** is

- An unavoidable medical or dental appointment
- A recognised religious holiday
- An exceptional or urgent family circumstance
- Is sick, or has an infectious disease

**ON TUESDAYS** Parents are now required to phone the office before recess to verify and confirm the early leave details. Students will not be issued with an early leave pass until their scheduled time of departure and/or their leave has been approved.

All students seeking an early leave pass MUST NOW report to the administration office before school between 8.15-8.35 to ensure all leave records are up to date. This allows all teachers to be informed of early leavers for the current day. Notes at recess will NOT be accepted. Students seeking an early leave pass MUST get to school on time.

**SPORTS AFTERNOON** - Parents should also note that for students who are well enough to attend school but unfit for sporting activities, a separate room is provided on a Tuesday afternoon. This room is **NOT** the detention room but a room for students unable to participate in sport for that week or continuous weeks due to an injury.

The school can decline to accept as satisfactory an explanation for an absence and may record that absence as unjustified. Sport is a mandatory requirement for the award of the Year 10 School Certificate. Unsatisfactory attendance at school may affect the awarding of the School Certificate.

The competition will provide valuable exam experience for the School Certificate. **All students in Year 10 are expected to sit for the exam.** Students in other years are encouraged to participate. The competition is designed for students of all abilities.

## History News

This year the History faculty will continue its use of technology to make the learning process a little easier for Year 10 students and their teachers. A common complaint of teachers is that carefully prepared lessons can be ruined because students do not bring their copy of the issued textbook to school. A common complaint of students is the weight of a full bag of textbooks that has to be carried to school.

To deal with this issue, every student in Year 10 History will be issued with a CD containing the full text of the book 'Australia in the 20<sup>th</sup> Century', their main textbook. Hard copies of the book can then be used in class and follow-up work can be done at home using the CD, thus avoiding the need to carry a heavy book back and forth.

Even if teachers do not always use the material in the textbook it will still form a useful source of information for revision purposes as the year progresses. It is extremely important that students take care of the CDs and are able to return them in good condition at the end of the year otherwise this convenient system might not be able to be used in future years.

Across the board tests in History, used to establish a ranking for School Certificate purposes, will take place at the end of terms two and three. In term 2 the date will be **Wednesday 8 July during periods 7&8**. For reasons of exam security and the integrity of results, we will operate the policy as happens in the School Certificate and Higher School Certificate, of 'sit it or miss it'. In term 3 the exam will be on Monday 28 September in Week 10.

If a student misses either or both of these tests their ranking for submission purposes will be decided from the one test they do attempt and/or their classwork results in consultation between the class teacher and myself.
